What are Kettlebells?

Although Kettlebells have been around for decades, only recently has it caught the attention of mainstream athletes.

Kettlebells are bowling ball-sized cast iron weights with a single looped handle on top. Kettlebells range in weight from two pounds to over 100 pounds. Kettlebells are taking off in the West thanks to fitness programs like CrossFit.

People of all ages, levels and all walks of life, from housewives to deskbound executives, attend classes. Don't miss the opportunity to see demonstrations and learn all about Kettlebells.

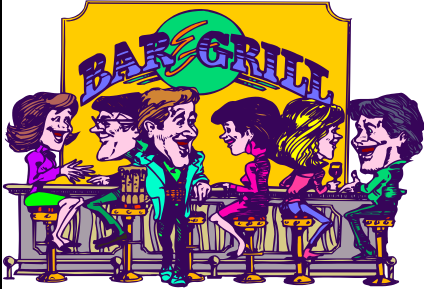

He was recruited by Doug Hawkland, who he has known since high school, because they wanted to streamline the membership process. Up until then, records were kept on paper and mailings were done by hand addressing envelopes for 1,319 members. Rick was the guy who started the database to keep track of memberships. He started using window envelopes for mailing renewals forms and membership cards. Rick also prints out labels monthly for the Schuss.



Rick has been married for 32 years to Judy since May 1977. Judy was neither a Club member nor a skier at the time they met. She is an intermediate skier and enjoys traveling to different areas. Rick and Judy lived in Anne Arundel County for two years before moving to Catonsville, where they have lived for 30 years. They have one son, Jack, who lives in Atlanta, GA and has been married for two years to Ginnie.

PERILS OF ELECTRONIC GADGETRY or... A WORD TO THE WISE

GPS



A couple of weeks ago a friend told me that someone she knew had their car broken into while they were at a football game. Their car was parked on the green which was adjacent to the football stadium and specially allotted to football fans. Things stolen from the car included a garage door remote control, some money and a GPS which had been prominently mounted on the dashboard.

When the victims got home, they found that their house had been ransacked and just about everything worth anything had been stolen. The thieves had used the GPS to guide them to the house. They then used the garage remote control to open the garage door and gain entry to the house. The thieves knew the owners were at the football game, they knew what time the game was scheduled to finish and so they knew how much time they had to clean out the house. It would appear that they had brought a truck to empty the house of its contents. Something to consider if you have a GPS - don't put your home address in it. Put a nearby address (like a store or gas station) so you can still find your way home if you need to, but no one else would know where you live if your GPS were stolen.

MOBILE PHONES

This lady has now changed her habit of how she lists her names on her mobile phone after her handbag was stolen. Her handbag, which contained her cell phone, credit card, wallet, etc. was stolen. Twenty minutes later when she called her hubby, from a pay phone telling him what had happened, hubby says 'I received your text asking about our PIN number and I replied a little while ago.'

When they rushed down to the bank, the bank staff told them the money was already withdrawn. The thief had actually used the stolen cell phone to text 'hubby' in the contact list and got hold of the pin number. Within 20 minutes he had withdrawn the money from their bank account.



Do not disclose the relationship between you and the people in your contact list. Avoid using names like Home, Honey, Hubby, Sweetheart, Dad, Mom, etc.... And very importantly, when sensitive info is being asked through texts, CONFIRM by calling back.

Also, when you're being text by friends or family to meet them somewhere, be sure to call back to confirm that the message came from them. If you don't reach them, be very careful about going places to meet 'family and friends' who text you.

8:00 p.m. HAUNTED TRAILS

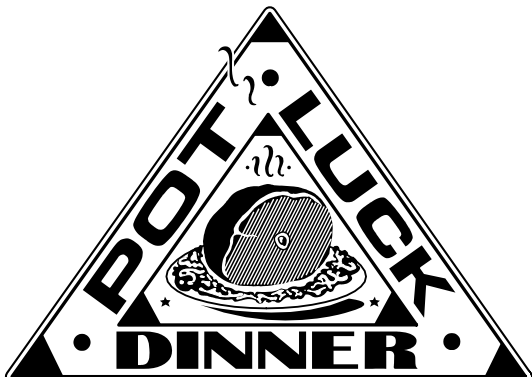

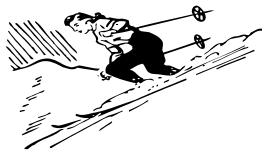

1ST DAY OF FALL BRINGS SNOW, COLD TO COLORADO

VAIL, Colo. - The first day of fall feels more like the first day of winter for some of the mountain West, with light snow and chilly temperatures across Colorado and freeze warnings for higher elevations in New Mexico, Wyoming, Nevada, Utah and Arizona.

A winter storm watch has been issued Tuesday for Boulder, Colo., and surrounding areas in the Rocky Mountain foothills.

Light snow was reported Monday in Vail and other mountain towns, and more was expected Tuesday. At least 3 inches of snow fell in parts of the foothills west of Denver.

Temperatures in Denver dipped into the upper 30s overnight, and low 30s in Flagstaff, Ariz.

The cold weather and snow have prompted Colorado's Loveland ski area to turn on its snowmaking machines earlier than planned.

National Ski Club News

Legal Pot on Breckenridge Ballot

Breckenridge is putting the legalization of pot on their November 2009 ballot. A local group needed 500 signatures from registered voters to get the measure on the ballot, but they submitted more than 1,400 -- just to make sure it got on. If passed, the law would remove local penalties for the private possession of up to one ounce of marijuana by adults 21 or older, effectively legalizing small amounts of marijuana for adults. As with other similar local and even state laws, there are still federal laws against possession -- but usually there is no one to enforce them. New Funicular for Aosta Valley

A rare new funicular railway built for skiers, is currently under construction in Italy's Aosta Valley. Although funicular railways were one of the original means for skiers to get uphill a century ago and even earlier, new ones rarely appear now because of the high construction costs compared to cable cars and gondolas. The funicular will replace the old Frachey-Alpe Ciarcerio double chairlift in the Monterosa area and will open during the coming 2009-2010 winter season.

DIA to Vail Rail Line Cost Estimate

A recent report estimated that it will cost approximately \$15 billion to build a passenger rail route from Denver to Vail's airport with stops in Keystone and Frisco. The Rocky Mountain Rail Authority, which was created by 45 cities and counties in Colorado, prepared the estimated cost of the rail line that would parallel I-70.
