FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT BECOMING A SKI/SNOWBOARD INSTRUCTOR

What types of instructor positions are available at Liberty Mt.?

- * **Junior Volunteer Instructors**- both Alpine and Snowboard (ages 15-18 Must be 15 by Dec. 1,2012). Juniors participate in an intern program where they are in the role of assisting and learning. Juniors receive their free skiing/boarding as compensation-No pay! Must work on a Saturday or Sunday (8am – 4pm) each week-end during the winter season. **PA Work permits are REQUIRED for anyone under 18 years of age.** Email Cathy Hoffman if you are under 18 years old and the work permit form will be e-mailed to you!
- * **Part time Instructors**-both Alpine and Snowboard must be age 17 & up (Must be 17 by Dec. 1,2012). We need Instructors for weekends and weekdays and every evening. Instructors with availability DURING THE WEEK-DAYS are heartily welcomed. Hourly wages are based on actual teaching time.
- * **Full time Instructors**- both Alpine and Snowboard (Age 17& up-Must be 17 by Dec.1,2012) need to work five or six shifts per week. Full timers receive show up pay Monday through Friday; they also receive preference on private lessons and generally teach 5-6 hours per day.
- * **Children Instructors**- Full time and Part time – Alpine and Snowboard
- * **Adaptive Volunteer Instructors** – give Alpine and Snowboard instructions to people with disabilities. Contact Leslie White at contact@brasski.org
- * **Race coach** – Saturday & Sunday. Hourly wage is based on experience and coaching credentials.
- * **Race or Snowsport School Volunteer**- Assist the coach/instructor organize the activities. Volunteers receive their free skiing as compensation.

MORE NEW TERRAIN FOR BRECKENRIDGE

Breckenridge Ski Resort has received approval from the Forest Service for a 543-acre terrain expansion in the Peak 6 area of Breckenridge of intermediate runs and high alpine bowl skiing, which is expected to open in the 2013-2014 ski season, Peak 6 will include 400 acres of lift-served terrain and 143 acres of hiking terrain. With the expansion there will also be a new, high-speed, six person chairlift and a new fixed-grip chair accessing Peak 6. This will be the first ski terrain expansion on U.S. Forest Service land in Colorado since 2008 and the first at Breckenridge since the Peak 7 expansion in 2002.

TAOS GETS APPROVAL FOR NEW EXPERT TERRAIN

The U.S. Forest Service has approved Taos Ski Valley's request to expand its expert terrain by 60 percent, serviced by two new lifts that will go to high alpine areas, West Ridge and Kachina Peak, which are currently accessible by hiking. The resort's plan also calls for upgrades to three other lifts, construction of a tubing facility, a snowshoe trail system, and lift-served mountain bike trails for the summer.

SNOWBIRD'S NEW LIFT

A new high-speed detachable quad is being installed at Snowbird this summer to replace the fixed-grip, two-seater Little Cloud lift that has served the bowl below American Fork Twin Peaks since 1980.

NEW LIFTS AT SQUAW VALLEY

Squaw Valley is installing a new, high-speed six-seater, the Big Blue Express, to replace the High Camp chair. It will extend to the top of the Shirley Lake ridgeline and provide access to the Shirley Lake, Solitude and Granite Chief chairs plus beginner and intermediate terrain that was previously inaccessible via the old High Camp chairlift. The new Park Pulley, a tow lift, was also installed to provide easier access to the Belmont terrain park and eliminate traversing across the mountaintop meadow. In addition the Links double chair was removed and replaced with a triple chairlift named Mountain Meadow.

The Aspen Skiing Company announced that it will open 230 acres of new terrain on Burnt Mountain this season, making the Snowmass Ski Area the second-largest ski resort in Colorado -- behind Vail. The terrain is east of the Longshot run, and like that trail, will be accessed by a short hike from the top of the Elk Camp lift. With the expansion, Snowmass can boast of having 3,362 skiable acres.

Informal meetings are held **May - Aug.** at area bars.

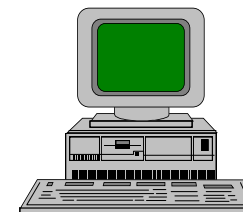
