On February 9, 2013, the Baltimore Ski Club's team of 4 participated in Ski4Life 2013 held at Roundtop Mountain Resort. Ski4Life is a fundraising ski and snowboard event to "send cancer downhill" on the slopes in honor of cancer survivors and in memory of those lost to the disease. The team members were Eileen Karczmarek, Joe Remsky, Mark Chapman and Tricia Sturm. With only 5 weeks to fundraise, the team raised \$1655.00 to benefit The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society. LLS is the world's largest voluntary health agency dedicated to blood cancer. The Society's mission is to cure leukemia, lymphoma, Hodgkin's

disease and myeloma, and improve the quality of life of patients and their families.

Participants were greeted at registration by staff members of LLS, as well as members the Susquehanna Ski Club, Ski4Life's founder, with breakfast and a knapsack of little goodies as well as numbered bib to wear throughout the day. After the opening ceremony, participants navigated a set course on the mountain designated to earn them a certain vertical feet value for each loop. Skiers then passed thru a tent where a special tag worn by the skier was scanned by an event volunteer to keep track of the accumulation of individual and team vertical feet at the end of the loop. A group of folks were always on hand at the entrance of the tent with cowbells and other noisemakers cheering the participants on throughout the day.

Lunch was provided in the Ski Thru Tent and hot chocolate was available later in the afternoon during the Mission Moment, when cancer survivors took a few minutes to tell their stories of survival. The day ended with a dinner and awards ceremony. All participants also received a medal for their efforts. Over \$130,000.00 was raised in total by sponsors, snowflake sales, and online giving!

Following the event, a very nice email was received by BSC team members from Becky Havice, Past President of the Susquehanna Ski Club, thanking us for participating in the event. She stated that over the past few years, the SSC has been attempting to get other ski clubs in the Blue Ridge and Eastern PA Ski Councils involved in Ski4Life and the Baltimore Ski Club has been the very first club to take them up on the offer. This certainly was a worthwhile undertaking for the BSC and hopefully we will be able to surpass our fundraising efforts for next year.

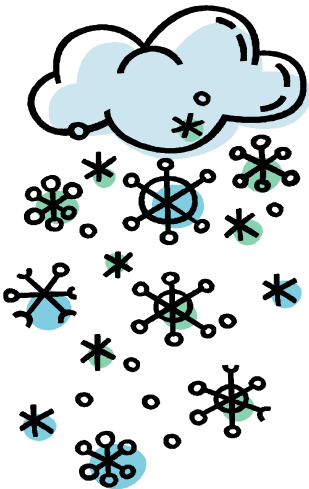

Trip Report – Sunday River – January 20 – 25, 2013

The trip started with a big surprise – the assistant trip leader missed the bus! Alan Leberknight was on his first-ever such assignment and made it a memorable and embarrassing start due to the fact he was, apparently, catching up on his beauty rest. However, he made a significant recovery by catching an Air Tran flight from BWI to Portland, Maine, finding a shuttle from Portland to Sunday River, and getting to the hotel 4 hours before the bus! Regardless of Alan's initial absence, trip leader Joe Remsky kept everything under control during the bus ride to Maine and thereafter during the week.

The group had a great first evening with good pizza, salads and desserts, and the Ravens vs the Patriots on TV in our assigned room right off the hotel lobby. Our cheers often brought people in from the lobby to hear what happened, and they were always disappointed to learn we were from Baltimore cheering a big Raven's play. This was especially good fun for us.

We awoke Monday morning to clear, cold weather and quite good skiing, but didn't realize it would be our "warmest" day of the week. By Wednesday and Thursday we had brutal cold with high winds that closed several lifts for significant parts of the day. This was made worse by us staying at the Jordan Grand on the far side of the mountain, and depending on the Jordan lift to get us to the middle mountains. Because of its frequent closure we were forced to take a 15 minute shuttle ride to catch an operating lift, and return the same way whenever choosing to quit for the day.

Regardless of the cold and wind, however, we still had some good skiing; most trails were open and well groomed, but thin snow coverage eliminated glade skiing for those who wanted some fun in the trees. Some brave souls even had an exciting time in the hot tubs, with minus 10 degree outside temperatures and totally frozen hair.

We had two wonderful group dinners and two nights on our own, with most people joining one of two separate groups for those nights. Everyone was very friendly and the relatively small number of trip participants – 24 – permitted us to get to know each other quite well. Overall, a very nice and totally enjoyable atmosphere was generated during the week.

Because the high winds and bitter cold continued into Friday, including a "wind hold" on the Jordan and several other lifts, the group unanimously agreed to forego skiing that day and leave early. It's good we did because snow and poor road conditions in Connecticut and the New York City area took extra time and delayed our arrival until the regularly scheduled time.

Although the weather created less than ideal conditions, it was still a fun trip with some good skiing and wonderful camaraderie.

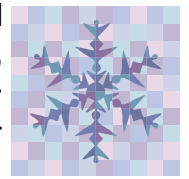
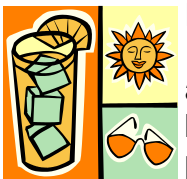


The Baltimore Ski CLUB Your 4-Season Sport & Social Club

Information for TRIP LEADER APPLICANTS

Thank you for your interest in becoming a ski trip leader for the Baltimore Ski Club, Inc. The selection of leaders is made by the trip committee from eligible applicants based on evaluation of your completed application form. Important factors in this evaluation include (1) the history of the applicant's participation and active involvement in the BSC during the five years (maximum) preceding the season under consideration and (2) the applicant's prior experience record with the BSC. Other parameters affecting eligibility include the following:

- ❄ Applicant should have been a BSC member for at least one season for Eastern trips and two seasons for Euro/Western trips.
- ❄ Applicant for assistant trip leader position on Euro/Western trips must have served as a leader for an Eastern trip. Applicant for Euro/Western leader position must have served as assistant on a Euro/Western trip.
- ❄ Applications will not be considered from persons who have led or assisted on trips for the past two years until all qualified candidates have been placed. Experienced leaders during a sit-out year may submit an application form. However, upon rating by the respective committee, they will be placed on standby status and would serve only as a last resort, pending placement of all other qualified applicants that year. Applicants who are asked to lead or assist on their sit-out year will still be considered as having sat out their year.
- ❄ Assistant leaders will not automatically ascend to Leaders the next ski season. Furthermore, assistants will not automatically take over as leader should the leader withdraw prior to departure.
- ❄ The spouse or significant other of a leader cannot be selected as assistant leader for the same trip.
- ❄ Applicants should be accessible by "local" telephone numbers and a PC is strongly recommended with inter-net access.
- ❄ Applicants must agree to attend a trip leader training session. The general membership meeting is a 'must attend' commitment until the trip departs.

The leader or assistant leader who resigns from a trip after September 1st will be deemed to have served for that season and will be responsible for his/her non-recoverable costs.

Financial records for a trip must be submitted within 30 days of the actual return trip date. Slightly incomplete records are acceptable to meet this requirement. Failure to meet this schedule or to provide complete reports may affect an applicant's future evaluation.

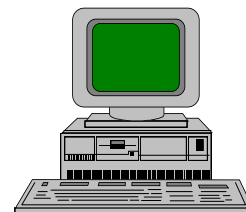
