President February 2014 message

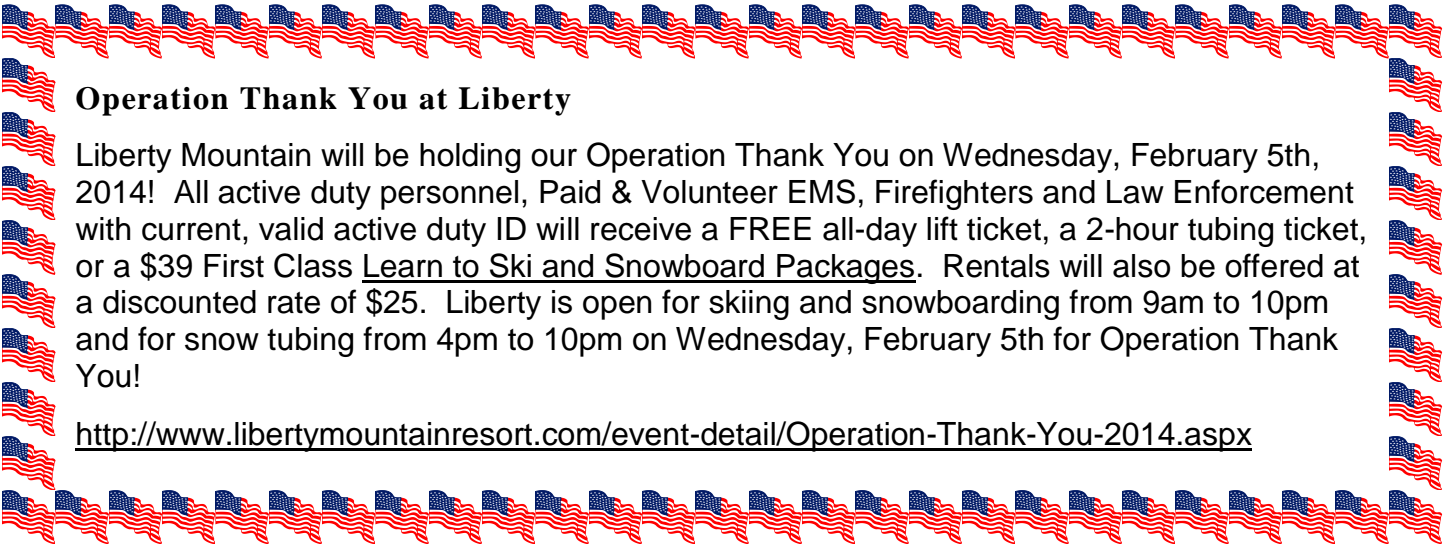
The 2nd polar vortex upon us! Ski resorts along the East coast are experiencing their best conditions in years. Now if it only warms up a little, I can go out and ski.

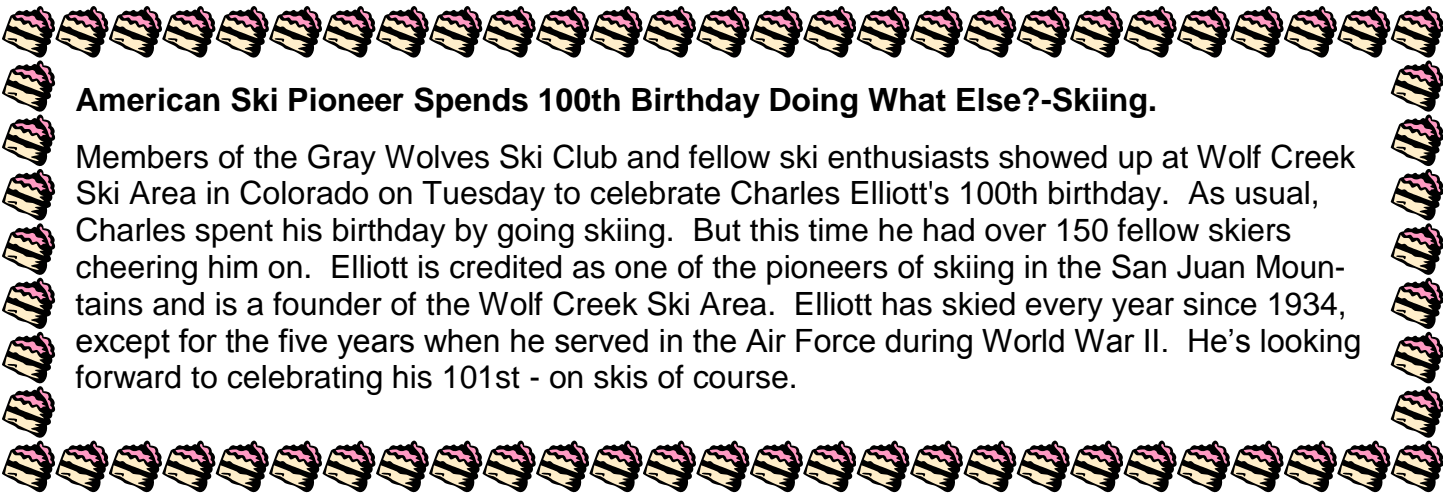

What Else is Happening In North America's Ski Industry?

Sugar Bowl Resort will get a new chair lift on the west side of the resort. The Crow's Peak chairlift, a fixed-grip Doppelmayr triple, will provide lift-service just below the Crow's Nest Peak. The new chairlift will be ready for the 2013/14 ski season.

A dozen western ski resorts have created the **Powder Alliance**... **Crested Butte**, Colorado; **Snowbasin Resort**, Utah; **Sierra-at-Tahoe**, China Peak, and Mountain High, California; Stevens Pass and **Schweitzer**, Washington; **Timberline** and **Mt. Hood Skibowl**, Oregon; **Arizona Snowbowl**; **Angel Fire Resort**, New Mexico; and **Bridger Bowl**, Montana will offer free lift access to "anytime" passholders from other member resorts. For the price of an anytime local season pass, Powder Alliance resort members receive three free days at all other participating areas, plus special offers on lodging, rentals, and buddy tickets. Details are available at www.powderalliance.com.

Red Mountain Resort (British Columbia) has announced that its recent expansion into Grey Mountain will now have a fixed-grip Poma quad chairlift. Grey Mountain marked one of the single largest expansions of an existing resort in North America in four decades and places Red Mountain Resort in the major resort category.

Mt. Brighton, Michigan, now owned by Vail Resorts, has replaced its Blue and Green lifts with a new quad chairlift. They also replaced the Yellow lift with a quad and have a new orientation of the Silver lift to improve the skiing on the back side of the hill. All other lifts will also see improvements to their functionality and they replaced a rope tow. The base area will be transformed in a modern urban architectural design with significant improvements to all of the existing facilities, including a complete remodel of the restaurant, and the addition of a new quick-service restaurant and a new Children's Ski & Ride School Center.

Choosing Goggle Lens Color and Fit

The right ski goggles will not only protect your eyes from UV rays, wind, snow, ice, twigs and branches but will also provide maximum visibility and comfort. You'll ski much more comfortably and successfully if you learn how to choose the right ski goggles for your next trip to the slopes. Goggle shoppers can find everything from basic eye/fog protection for less than \$75 all the way up to GPS-enabled models with interchangeable lenses for hundreds of dollars more. New this winter: rimless designs that promise maximum visibility.






Lens Shape: Lenses are usually either flat or spherical.





Flat. The lens curves left-to-right across your eyes and face, but the lens surface is vertically flat (between the nose and forehead). Flat-lens goggles are priced lower and work fine, but the flatness can cause more glare and slightly reduces peripheral vision.

Spherical. This lens, too, curves across your eyes and face, but it also curves vertically. Curved spherical lenses give better peripheral vision, less distortion and less glare, but their cost is higher.

Selecting a Lens Color

Note: VLT (visible light transmission) figures provided by goggle manufacturers. The amount of light that reaches your eyes through the lens is called the **visible light transmission (VLT)**. Lighter tints have a higher VLT because more light passes through the lens. Darker lenses have lower VLT because less light passes through the lens.

Lens Features

Mirroring: Mirrored lenses have a partial or full lens coating on the outside of the outer lens.

This reflects more light and thus allows in less light (10% to 50%) than non-mirrored goggles.

Polarizing: A polarizing filter's primary function is to reduce glare from sunlight on snow or water.

Goggle FAQs

Q: Do ski goggles and snowboard goggles offer basically the same function and protection?

A: Yes, differences are mainly cosmetic.

Q: What lens colors are best for bright, sunny days?

A: Brown, gray and copper-colored lenses all offer reduced VLT (visible light transmission) and thus excel on bluebird days.

Q: What lens colors should I consider for snowy or overcast days?

A: Yellow, gold, amber, green or rose-colored lenses all offer increased VLT and make good choices on socked-in days.

Q: What lens color should I use for night skiing?

A: Go with goggles that offer a clear lens option.

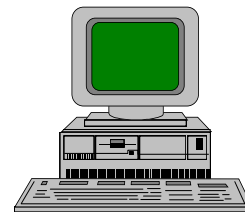
