One of the most gratifying advantages of being a ski club member is that when injuries do occur it seems our members willingly help those that are hurt.

Members have started to ask me where we'll be going next year. Except for the Blue Ridge Ski Council trip to Mt. Bachelor – I don't know! The trips committee will be meeting soon to evaluate all the trip surveys (hopefully you filled one out) and compile a list of possible destinations. Afterwards the trips director, with list in hand, travels to the Mountain Travel Symposium and meets with vendors from the selected areas. While there he also looks for 'deals and steals' being offered by various resorts. Once the list has been edited, the trips director sends the list of selected destinations to several ski travel specialists for bids. These specialists who put together ski packages send their bids back to the trips director. The trips committee meets again and evaluates the bids that have been received for each destination and selects the best package deal. All of this has to happen fairly quickly, since we try to publish the BSC 2014-2015 trip schedule in the May newsletter. The trips committee is comprised of: the president, trips director, Eastern trips chair, Eastern trips treasurer, Western trips chair, Western trips treasurer, the BSC general treasurer, and the membership chair.

## Blind Teens Hit the Slopes At Wisp Resort

Winter sports are often billed as a fun activity for everyone, and Tuesday students from the Maryland School of the Blind truly proved that.

Laurel Kirby, 16, is a freshman at the Maryland School for the blind. Her premature birth left her with little vision.

"Because I had to be on so much oxygen when I was born, my retinas detached," she said. "They were able to get some of the vision back in the left eye, but my right eye stopped growing and I became totally blind in my right eye."

But her condition doesn't stop her from enjoying a cool afternoon on the slopes. "My very first time I was a little nervous at first, said Kirby. "Last year, I skied backwards and almost fell but I caught myself. Today I did really well." Bumps, turns, and other skiers present obstacles to people who can see. And if you can't it requires guides to get you down safely.

"You have to talk to them, do a lot of communication as you go down, like, it's getting steep here so you need to snowplow, or we're going down a really steep hill, or we're going around a really sharp turn," said Rachael Huxford. "They rely on you a lot and that's not something kids our age are used to."

Those guides are local teens from Garret County schools who volunteer for the program, which is sponsored by the Deep Creek Lions Club. "It's really fun and they definitely have a go-to attitude," said Huxford. "And that's all that really matters."

Despite the guides, the skiing is far from easy. "There is this one position where you have to stand up straight, and that's to get good speed," said Kirby. "And to slow you down you bend your knees which is really hard do to especially when you're on a steep hill.

But it's always fun. "It's a really good experience," she added. "Normally I just ice skate but I get to ski, and I'm the only person in my family who can ski."

## **BALTIMORE SKI CLUB**

### Information for TRIP LEADER APPLICANTS

*Thank you for your interest in becoming a ski trip leader for the Baltimore Ski Club, Inc. The selection of leaders is made by the trip committee from eligible applicants based on evaluation of your completed application form. Important factors in this evaluation include (1) the history of the applicant's participation and active involvement in the BSC during the five years (maximum) preceding the season under consideration and (2) the applicant's prior experience record with the BSC. Other parameters affecting eligibility include the following:\*

- \* Applicant should have been a BSC member for at least one season for Eastern trips and two seasons for Euro/Western trips.
- \* Applicant for assistant trip leader position on Euro/Western trips must have served as a leader for an Eastern trip. Applicant for Euro/Western leader position must have served as assistant on a Euro/Western trip.
- \* Applications will not be considered from persons who have led or assisted on trips for the past two years until all qualified candidates have been placed. Experienced leaders during a sit-out year may submit an application form. However, upon rating by the respective committee, they will be placed on standby status and would serve only as a last resort, pending placement of all other qualified applicants that year. Applicants who are asked to lead or assist on their sit-out year will still be considered as having sat out their year.
- \* Assistant leaders will not automatically ascend to Leaders the next ski season. Furthermore, assistants will not automatically take over as leader should the leader withdraw prior to departure.
- \* The spouse or significant other of a leader cannot be selected as assistant leader for the same trip.
- \* Applicants should be accessible by "local" telephone numbers and a PC is strongly recommended with inter-net access.
- \* Applicants must agree to attend a trip leader training session. The general membership meeting is a 'must attend' commitment until the trip departs.

The leader or assistant leader who resigns from a trip after September 1<sup>st</sup> will be deemed to have served for that season and will be responsible for his/her non-recoverable costs.

Financial records for a trip must be submitted within 30 days of the actual return trip date. Slightly incomplete records are acceptable to meet this requirement. Failure to meet this schedule or to provide complete reports may affect an applicant's future evaluation.

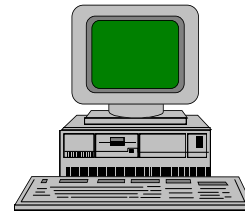
