PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

It's almost time to swap your sandals for ski boots as the 'lazy days of summer' will soon turn to autumn! What does this mean? The ski season will be here sooner than you think. Our September General Meeting will continue to highlight our fantastic trip lineup for the upcoming ski season. Trip leaders will be on hand with the latest trip information and will be happy to answer your questions and accept deposits. Sales of our 2015 winter trips are well under way. So, don't delay if you want to ski with all your BSC friends this winter.

Traditionally, the BSC alternates the Snowmass and Vail trip every other year because of the popularity of these two destinations. Other popular trip destinations can take from three to seven years to be part of our trip line-up depending on scheduling, cost and demand. For instance, the last time we've been to Winter Park was in 2000 and Mt. Bachelor in 2007. The Blue Ridge Ski Council trip is to Mt Bachelor and it will be the first time for many of the Blue Ridge clubs to experience skiing in Oregon. Mt Bachelor, the town of Bend, and the BRSC, are promoting this trip with more activities geared to non-skiers and skiers/snowboarders alike. If you would like to try a new destination, consider Mt. Bachelor.

We also have three great trips on the East Coast: Okemo, Stowe, and Sunday River. Our East Coast trips are great for the budget-minded skier/snowboarder or if your vacation time is limited. **Okemo Mountain Resort** is a long weekend trip in January and is a great choice if you want to get your ski legs warmed up. Rising above the village of Ludlow, in south-central Vermont, Okemo is a playground that built its reputation for quality and superior guest service as a winter retreat for skiers and snowboarders. Okemo offers 655 acres of terrain with 96% snowmaking coverage. The mountain boasts a vertical drop of 2,200 feet and offers 8 terrain parks and trails of 32% novice, 37% intermediate, 31% advance terrain.

The Stowe and Sunday River trips run Sunday through Friday. Open slopes and no airports hassles—What's not to love? **Stowe Mountain Resort** has historically been a favorite eastern ski location for BSC members. Stowe's newest facilities and improvements include: a brand new High-Speed Quad on Mt. Mansfield, RFID technology tickets and gates, an inter-mountain transfer gondola connecting Mt. Mansfield and Spruce Peak, new high-speed lifts on Spruce, new base facilities, restaurants and more. Another favorite area, **Sunday River Mountain Resort**, is a very big resort spanning three miles long from White Cap to the Jordan Bowl and in between, 8 interconnected mountain peaks, 135 trails, 820 acres plus the most powerful snowmaking system in the world.

I'm excited about our trip schedule for this coming year and feel there is a trip destination[s] for everyone. I've signed up for Mt. Bachelor and Winter Park and can't wait to go! See you in September . . . *Mike*

If proposing a non-ski trip, provide a resume with your experience detailing your qualifications to lead such trip.

ALL PRICES ARE ESTIMATED: All trips are subject to price adjustments due to potential airline fuel surcharge, increased security fees and airline ticket price fluctuations.

Minimum trip deposits are \$250 for all trips.

BSC Trips Cancellation Policy

- The Club does not intend to unduly penalize a trip participant who cancels from a BSC trip. However, other trip participants should not have to incur additional costs due to your cancellation.
- Deposits and payments made toward the trip reservations being cancelled will be held until such time as a determination can be made that the Club or trip participants will not incur additional costs due to non-recoverable costs.
- Non-recoverable costs are defined as those that are associated with the trip that due to contractual obligations cannot be recovered when the individual cancels his/her trip. Non-recoverable also include those costs associated with replacing a person or persons on a trip (i.e., name change charges on airline tickets, etc.) Refunds, if any, will be made based on the non-recoverable involved plus a cancellation fee. Cancellation costs will not exceed the cost of the trip. Club cancellation fee will be dropped if non-recoverable costs exceed 50% of the trip cost.
- Replacement of a trip participant by a trip participant is strictly prohibited. Only the Trip Leader or Assistant Trip Leader can replace a trip participant who is unable to go on the trip. The canceling trip participant may suggest a replacement candidate to the trip leader or assistant trip leader, however the canceling trip participant is responsible for the cancellation fee (if applicable) and any non-recoverable costs.
- Be sure to know the cancellation dates in relation to the trip you select so that you can avoid monetary losses. The following cancellation policy is in effect in relation to BSC trips. NR=Non-recoverable costs

Multi-Day Bus, Carpool or Flight trips:

More than 125 days before departure - \$0

More than 110 days before departure - \$10 & NR

More than 80 days before departure - \$25 & NR

80 days or less before departure - \$35 & NR

Informal meetings are held **May - Aug.** at area bars.

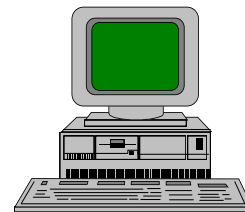
