15th Annual Chesapeake Bay Paddlefest



DATE: Saturday, May 16, 2015 11am-4pm

LOCATION: Gunpowder Falls State Park - Hammerman Beach, in Baltimore County, Maryland

Our pristine waterfront facility is the perfect setting for a paddle sports demo day. The spectacular Gunpowder River is one of only two fresh water rivers feeding the Chesapeake Bay. That means clean, fresh water, and that means NO JELLYFISH! You will have free access to dozens of 2014 kayaks and stand up paddleboards. Our launch site is second to none: a huge stretch of sandy beach, shallow water and hundreds of acres of gorgeous parkland in every direction.

REGISTRATION and CHECK-IN

Kayak and SUP Demos, Clinics and entertainment are FREE to the public. The event will be held rain or shine. Although there is no fee for the event, the Maryland State Park does charge a \$5/person admission fee for guests arriving in vehicles with Maryland tags, and \$7/person for vehicles from out-of-state. To take part in the free demos, all guests must register at the Registration Tent and complete a liability release waiver. Kayak and SUP Demos are only available to ages 13 and over. All minors participating must have the signature of a parent. Appropriate shoes are mandatory for all demos (i.e. water sports shoes, sandals, Tevas or similar, scuba/snorkeling booties, tennis shoes are acceptable. Bare feet will NOT be permitted on demo gear and flip flops are NOT recommended.

INSTRUCTION

Separate introductory kayak and SUP dryland clinics will be offered at the following times: 1pm, 2pm, 3pm and 4pm. These clinics are for entry-level students ONLY and will run approximately 35 minutes in duration. Because we must limit the size of each clinic, registration in advance is necessary. All clinic students must be age 16 and up. To register, simply email us at info@ultimatewatersports.com with the following info: full name, age, lesson time and be sure to specify kayak or SUP lesson. LIMIT OF ONE LESSON PER PERSON. Please write PADDLEFEST CLINIC in the subject line of your email. You will receive a return email confirming your free clinic.

Demo KAYAKS will be available from Old Town, Necky, Wilderness Systems, Ocean Kayak, and more!! Paddles and life jackets (PFDs) will also be provided at no charge. You may bring your own PFD if you prefer. Manufacturer representatives and kayak experts will be on hand to assist you in selecting your demo gear and to answer all your questions.

STAND UP PADDLE BOARD (SUP) DEMOS

Demo STAND UP PADDLE BOARDS will be available from Mistral, Bic Sport, Naish, NSP, NRS and more! Paddles and life jackets will also be provided at no charge. You may bring your own PFD if you prefer. SUP experts will be on hand to assist you in selecting your demo gear and to answer all your questions.

Information for TRIP LEADER APPLICANTS

Thank you for your interest in becoming a ski trip leader for the Baltimore Ski Club, Inc. The selection of leaders is made by the trip committee from eligible applicants based on evaluation of your completed application form. Important factors in this evaluation include (1) the history of the applicant's participation and active involvement in the BSC during the five years (maximum) preceding the season under consideration and (2) the applicant's prior experience record with the BSC. Other parameters affecting eligibility include the following:

- ❄ Applicant should have been a BSC member for at least one season for Eastern trips and two seasons for Euro/Western trips.
- ❄ Applicant for assistant trip leader position on Euro/Western trips must have served as a leader for an Eastern trip. Applicant for Euro/Western leader position must have served as assistant on a Euro/Western trip.
- ❄ Applications will not be considered from persons who have led or assisted on trips for the past two years until all qualified candidates have been placed. Experienced leaders during a sit-out year may submit an application form. However, upon rating by the respective committee, they will be placed on standby status and would serve only as a last resort, pending placement of all other qualified applicants that year. Applicants who are asked to lead or assist on their sit-out year will still be considered as having sat out their year.
- ❄ Assistant leaders will not automatically ascend to Leaders the next ski season. Furthermore, assistants will not automatically take over as leader should the leader withdraw prior to departure.
- ❄ The spouse or significant other of a leader cannot be selected as assistant leader for the same trip.
- ❄ Applicants should be accessible by "local" telephone numbers and a PC is strongly recommended with inter-net access.
- ❄ Applicants must agree to attend a trip leader training session. The general membership meeting is a 'must attend' commitment until the trip departs.

The leader or assistant leader who resigns from a trip after September 1st will be deemed to have served for that season and will be responsible for his/her non-recoverable costs.

Financial records for a trip must be submitted within 30 days of the actual return trip date. Slightly incomplete records are acceptable to meet this requirement. Failure to meet this schedule or to provide complete reports may affect an applicant's future evaluation.

SKI INDUSTRY NEWS

Mammoth Mountain Owners Buy Big Bear and Snow Summit By Bob Wilbanks, NSCN
The owners of the Mammoth Mountain Ski Area are purchasing California's Big Bear Mountain Resorts -- including Bear Mountain and Snow Summit -- which are just two miles apart and connected by shuttle. The Southern California ski and snowboard resorts, combined, have 55 runs on 438 acres served by 26 lifts and attain nearly 800,000 skier days annually. When added to Mammoth and June's figures, this transaction has created one of the nation's largest ski companies with over two million visitors per year. Mammoth Mountain CEO, Rusty Gregory, in an interview with the Mammoth Times said that it's the first step of a large expansion for Mammoth, June Mountain, Big Bear, and Snow Summit. The company's multi-resort expansion plans will include a new base lodge as well as upgrading the J1 lift at June, along with facilities upgrades at Big Bear and Snow Summit. Gregory said the acquisition represents "the beginning of a renaissance for both Mammoth and Big Bear and is the first step in the next era of skiing and riding in California. It's a whole lot of things," he said. "It's winter, it's summer and a very full resort planning process." There's also a new season pass, the "Cali4nia Pass" that includes unrestricted access to Mammoth, June Mountain, Big Bear, and Snow Summit, for \$689 for adults. Closing of the transaction is subject to certain conditions, including Big Bear Mountain Resort shareholder approval and transfer of the U.S. Forest Service Permit that permits operations on nearly 1,500 acres of the San Bernardino National Forest.

MORE SKI INDUSTRY NEWS

NEW LIFT IN JACKSON HOLE Jackson Hole is opening one of the last non-lift-served sections of 10,450-foot Rendezvous Mountain with a shiny new high-speed chairlift, the Teton lift, in the 2015-16 season -- which will be Jackson's 50th anniversary.

DURANGO MOUNTAIN RESORT TO BE CALLED PURGATORY AGAIN The new owner of Durango Mountain Resort, James Coleman, is planning to change the resort's name back to Purgatory to celebrate the resort's 50th anniversary at the beginning of the 2015-2016 ski season according to the Denver Post.

INCREASED AIR ACCESS TO U.S. RESORTS Montana's Bozeman-Yellowstone International Airport airline seats have increased by 20% for this year. The increased winter air service will be with a Delta Airlines flight from Seattle, WA and United Airlines from Houston. The new flights bring a total of 14 non-stop flights into Bozeman-Yellowstone International Airport (BZN) that serves both Big Sky and Bridger Bowl ski resorts. Tahoe just got a lot closer for East Coast skiers as JetBlue announced it will be the only airline to offer nonstop service between Nevada's Reno-Tahoe International Airport (RNO) and New York's JFK on May 28, 2015. United Airlines now has once-a-week direct flights from Chicago to Montana's Flathead Valley in winter. The service, aimed at skiers, will run on Saturdays from Dec. 20 through April 4. Whitefish Mountain is located 19 miles from the airport. The Glacier Airline Enhancement and Retention Outreach committee, or Glacier AERO, raised \$240,000 for a revenue guarantee to secure the Chicago service.

Informal meetings are held **May - Aug.** at area bars.

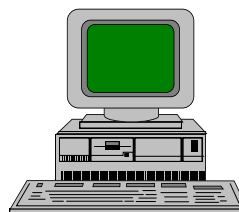
