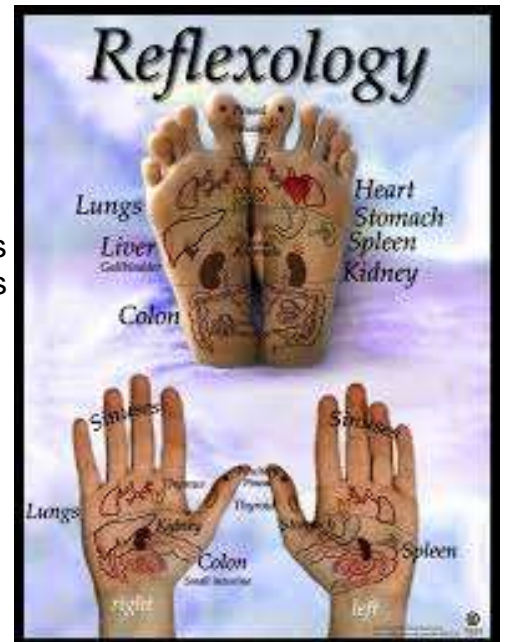

Some of the trip highlights:

Budapest – Enjoy an included guided tour. The major attractions of the Hungarian capital are easily reached on foot from the castle of Buda to the Fine Arts Museum, from the Opera to the Parliament, from the Basilica of St. Stephen to Margaret Island, and from Andrassy Ave to the Chain Bridge (the first that united the old cities of Buda and Pest over the Danube).

Vienna – The tourist attractions of this simultaneously old and modern city are in three distinct areas. The largest cluster is centered on Schönbrunn Palace, where you can wander the massive labyrinths of gardens, followed by Hofburg Palace, and the third, and newest, cluster of modern art museums is in Museumsquartier. Follow your guide for a highlights walking/tram tour of the city.

Olomuc – Stop for a midway break in Olomuc, Czech Republic en route to Wroclaw.

Wroclaw – (formerly Breslau) The Rynek Market Square is surrounded by townhouses funded by Wroclaw patricians resulting in superior architecture as well as a vibrant atmosphere in this busy square full of beautiful café bars and restaurants, and souvenir shops.

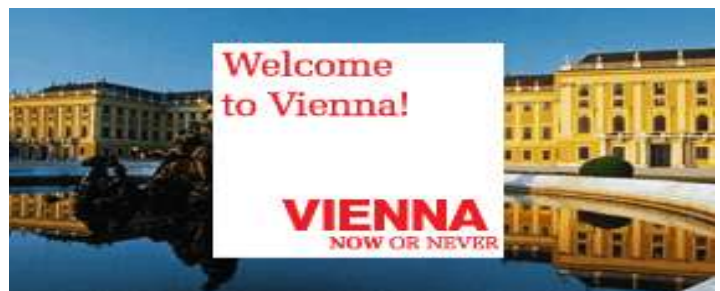

In Memory of Phil Ansell



Phil Ansell, age 69, passed away on December 19, 2015 of complications from a head injury following a recent fall.

Phil has been residing in the "emeritus" assisted living facility on Reisterstown Rd. in Pikesville since being diagnosed with Parkinson's disease about 2 years ago. Some of you have visited him there. Phil recently had a fall while in that facility, striking the left side of his face resulting in his fracturing the left orbital and upper jaw bones. He was transferred to the Gilchrest hospice facility in Towson where he was convalescing. Phil had slipped into a coma and passed away yesterday afternoon, apparently from complications stemming from this injury. He will be cremated, but there are no plans for a funeral service, per his wishes.

Phil grew up in Baltimore and attended the University of Baltimore. Upon graduation, he worked for the City of Baltimore in their transportation dept., but soon traded in his suit and tie for a more independent "outdoors" employment involving year round yard maintenance. A hard worker with a good work ethic, he ran this successful business, "Phil's Lawn Service", for over 30 years before his retirement several years ago due to Parkinson's disease.

Phil flashed a warm smile and had a dry sense of humor. For those who knew him, he could be a very funny and quick witted guy. He was a social person, enjoying organizing a group dinner or perhaps an impromptu lunch for a few friends at local restaurants.

Phil's nickname of "Fearless" stemmed from an incident in the early 90's while skiing in Breckenridge, Co. I had just met the man, and was watching him navigate a "bump run" in which he was clearly in over his head. As he picked his way down the slope, perhaps not with the best of form, but charging down the run nonetheless, I remarked to a fellow skier, "Look at that guy go, he's "Fearless!" and the name stuck.

While Phil never married, he was always surrounded by four legged companions, most recently his faithful dog, Shadow.

His leisure time included "windjammer cruises" and trips to Mexican resorts to snorkel, lay on the beach and zip about the countryside on motor-scooters. Earlier in his life he owned a powerboat and cruised the Middle River area. He also enjoyed bicycling our area's many "rail trails" but snow skiing was his greatest passion. He may not have excelled at these activities, but he just wanted to participate and be part of the group.

As some of us may know, Phil did have some physiological limitations and, yes, at times he could try one's patience. But he was a goodhearted guy who lived a good, honorable life. Phil was my friend, and I'm a better person for it. I'll miss him.

Two Top Mountain Adaptive Sports Foundation 5th Annual 100k Vertical Challenge

On Monday, Feb. 8, 2016, dozens of skiers and snowboarders will attempt to descend 100,000 vertical feet in a single day—107 runs at Whitetail Resort in Mercersburg, PA. The 12-plus-hour adventure aims to raise funds for and awareness of Two Top Mountain Adaptive Sports Foundation, which provides adaptive ski, snowboard and water ski lessons to disabled individuals, including wounded veterans from Walter Reed National Military Medical Center, Fort Belvoir and surrounding VA Medical Centers. All lessons for our disabled veterans and their families are **FREE**.

Last season, Two Top provided 775 lessons to disabled athletes. Over 500 of these lessons were disabled veterans and their family members.

The event is limited to 25 individuals and 25 teams, with each team composed of as many as four riders. Registration is first-come, first-served.

ALL PRICES ARE ESTIMATED: All trips are subject to price adjustments due to potential airline fuel surcharge, increased security fees and airline ticket price fluctuations. Minimum trip deposits are \$250 for all trips.

BSC Trips Cancellation Policy

1. The Club does not intend to unduly penalize a trip participant who cancels from a BSC trip. However, other trip participants should not have to incur additional costs due to your cancellation.
2. Deposits and payments made toward the trip reservations being cancelled will be held until such time as a determination can be made that the Club or trip participants will not incur additional costs due to non-recoverable costs.
3. Non-recoverable costs are defined as those that are associated with the trip that due to contractual obligations cannot be recovered when the individual cancels his/her trip. Non-recoverable also include those costs associated with replacing a person or persons on a trip (i.e., name change charges on airline tickets, etc.) Refunds, if any, will be made based on the non-recoverable involved plus a cancellation fee. Cancellation costs will not exceed the cost of the trip. Club cancellation fee will be dropped if non-recoverable costs exceed 50% of the trip cost.
4. Replacement of a trip participant by a trip participant is strictly prohibited. Only the Trip Leader or Assistant Trip Leader can replace a trip participant who is unable to go on the trip. The canceling trip participant may suggest a replacement candidate to the trip leader or assistant trip leader, however the canceling trip participant is responsible for the cancellation fee (if applicable) and any non-recoverable costs.
5. Be sure to know the cancellation dates in relation to the trip you select so that you can avoid monetary losses. The following cancellation policy is in effect in relation to BSC trips. NR=Non-recoverable costs

More than 125 days before departure - \$0
More than 110 days before departure - greater of \$10 or NR

More than 80 days before departure - greater of \$25 or NR
80 days or less before departure - greater of \$35 or NR
