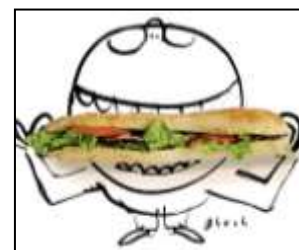

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The term "Think Snow" is common for skiers to use. It's a term full of hope that the coming season will have plentiful snow so that everyone has a great skiing experience. Although some of us are not accustomed to it, I find it a pleasure to glide over new snow on trails and through the glades. The problem with "Thinking Snow" is that there is no boundary for where it begins and where it ends. It's nice on the mountain but can be a real hassle at home. My wife says that it snows whenever I go away so Baltimore should prepare for snow storms sometime between Feb. 19th - 23rd and Mar. 13th - 20th.

When going on a trip, you need to prepare yourself in case winter weather changes your itinerary. This has been a frequent occurrence for me. I've had flights cancelled on trips 3 out of the last 5 years. With climate change and the airlines erring on the side of caution I expect this to happen more frequently. If this does occur, you need to let the trip leader and assistant make the arrangements to reschedule your flight and other transportation especially if this happens at the beginning of your trip.

Please plan ahead for emergencies. Always carry extra medication. If you park at the airport you should put a shovel in car in case you get plowed in. Finally, make sure that your pet-sitters, baby-sitters, house-sitters, etc. are aware that flight delays and cancellations occur frequently (especially for winter travel) and make sure that their schedules are flexible enough so that they can accommodate these changes. If not, have a plan B.

Ski4Life is an 8-hour ski and snowboard marathon, where participants raise money for the LLS mission to cure leukemia, lymphoma, Hodgkin's disease and myeloma and to improve the quality of life for patients and their families. Free skiing is available to people 65 and older this ski season at 97 resorts in 28 states. The free list of resorts offering free skiing is available at [SeniorsSkiing.com](http://www.seniorsskiing.com), the free online magazine for older skiers.

Many more resorts have deep discounts for older skiers. The editors of SeniorsSkiing.com advise looking online or asking when purchasing lift tickets. Each resort establishes the age threshold for free skiing, with the majority clustering around 70. Those who are 65 will qualify at Cataloche Ski Area and Wolf Ridge (NC), Cannon Mountain and McIntyre Ski Area (NH), Mt. Zion (MI), and Rotarun Ski Club (ID).

Alta Sierra Ski Resort in California sets its age at 90, as did Welch Village Ski Area in Minnesota. At Alta, the venerable Utah resort high in the Wasatch Mountains, the age is 80. Locals joke that to qualify, you need a note from your mother.

Some enjoyed the prime rib buffet downstairs while the rest of us went upstairs to have a more casual meal by the roaring fire. No matter where they ate, everyone said they enjoyed it.

Sunday the ski gods did not smile on us. It was raining, foggy, and the wind was gusting. Only a handful went out to try their luck on such a day, but no one stayed long. After everyone was back from the slopes we packed up and left a little early for home. On the way up we watched a variety of DVDs including The Beverly Hillbillies and the classic western, High Noon. On the way back the crowd was mellower, so we shared skiing stories, drank a little, and took advantage of the WiFi on the bus.

Some of the trip highlights:

Budapest – Enjoy an included guided tour. The major attractions of the Hungarian capital are easily reached on foot from the castle of Buda to the Fine Arts Museum, from the Opera to the Parliament, from the Basilica of St. Stephen to Margaret Island, and from Andrassy Ave to the Chain Bridge (the first that united the old cities of Buda and Pest over the Danube).

Vienna – The tourist attractions of this simultaneously old and modern city are in three distinct areas. The largest cluster is centered on Schönbrunn Palace, where you can wander the massive labyrinths of gardens, followed by Hofburg Palace, and the third, and newest, cluster of modern art museums is in Museumsquartier. Follow your guide for a highlights walking/tram tour of the city.

Olomuc – Stop for a midway break in Olomuc, Czech Republic en route to Wroclaw.

Wroclaw – (**formerly Breslau**) The Rynek Market Square is surrounded by townhouses funded by Wroclaw patricians resulting in superior architecture as well as a vibrant atmosphere in this busy square full of beautiful café bars and restaurants, and souvenir shops.

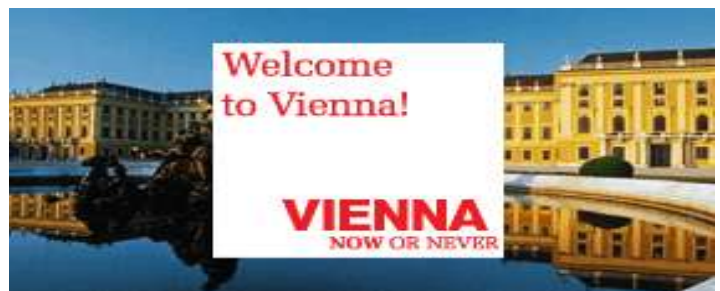

ALL PRICES ARE ESTIMATED: All trips are subject to price adjustments due to potential airline fuel surcharge, increased security fees and airline ticket price fluctuations. Minimum trip deposits are \$250 for all trips.

BSC Trips Cancellation Policy

1. The Club does not intend to unduly penalize a trip participant who cancels from a BSC trip. However, other trip participants should not have to incur additional costs due to your cancellation.
2. Deposits and payments made toward the trip reservations being cancelled will be held until such time as a determination can be made that the Club or trip participants will not incur additional costs due to non-recoverable costs.
3. Non-recoverable costs are defined as those that are associated with the trip that due to contractual obligations cannot be recovered when the individual cancels his/her trip. Non-recoverable also include those costs associated with replacing a person or persons on a trip (i.e., name change charges on airline tickets, etc.) Refunds, if any, will be made based on the non-recoverable involved plus a cancellation fee. Cancellation costs will not exceed the cost of the trip. Club cancellation fee will be dropped if non-recoverable costs exceed 50% of the trip cost.
