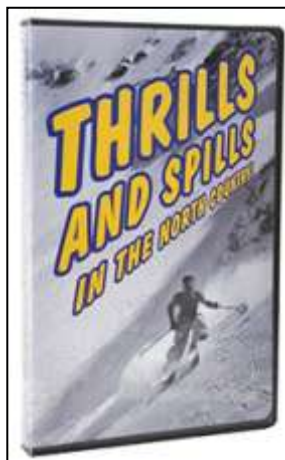

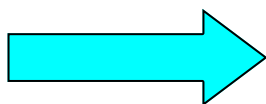

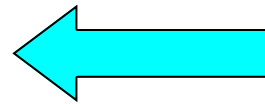

Visit one of America's Best Bootfitters today!

With the holiday rush over, February is the perfect month to head to your nearest boot fitting pro when you have your skis tuned and waxed to get your boots dialed in! What do you do when your boots don't fit? With properly fitting boots you can experience:

- ◆ **Improved performance:** Being properly fit and aligned will add new life to your skiing with no lessons in sight.
- ◆ **Improved comfort:** Because who doesn't dream of a better fit?
- ◆ **Custom fit:** Your boots should be as unique as your feet.
- ◆ **Improved warmth:** A properly fit ski boot is one more step to take towards that nirvana of toasty toes.

Forget Killington's Superstar minefield. The most difficult ski challenge you'll probably ever face is finding a comfortable fitting boot

1. **DON'T LISTEN TO YOUR FRIENDS** -Boots match your skill level, they must mate with your foot and leg shape.
2. **TAKE YOUR TIME—LOT'S OF IT** -Buying ski boots is a time-consuming process that too many skiers rush through.
3. **MAKE IT A ROUND-ROBIN ELIMINATION TOURNAMENT** Try different models and different sizes of the same model on your left and right feet. Keep the "winner" on and pit it against newcomers.
4. **SHOP WHEN NOBODY'S AROUND** For the best boot fit service, shops midweek in early fall at off-hours.
5. **TOO BIG IS A BIG PROBLEM** -A good fitting boot feels tight out of the box and may remain very snug during the first few days of skiing. Buying a boot that's too big can be painful and cause injuries. Oversized boots also hinder skiing and promote fatigue. You'll find yourself in the "backseat," clawing your toes and tightening your thigh muscles and hamstrings to maintain stability and control.
6. **SHELL FIT IS PARAMOUNT**- To check shell fit, remove the liner and put your foot in the shell. Slide your foot forward until your big toe touches the front. A finger to a finger-and-a-half of space between your heel and the shell will give you a good snug fit.
7. **BEWARE OF SHORTLASTED LINERS**-Ihave your boot tech check for a "short lasted" liner.
8. **THE CUFF IS IMPORTANT STUFF**- cuff is critical for controlling your skis. The cuff should wrap snugly with your buckle bails set somewhere near the beginning to middle of the ladders.
9. **BEWARE OF MARKED SIZES**- Use the manufacturer's marked size only as a guideline. The sole length and inner cavities of supposedly similarly sized models can vary significantly. We've seen boots marked 27.5 vary from 305mm to 314mm.

ALL PRICES ARE ESTIMATED: All trips are subject to price adjustments due to potential airline fuel surcharge, increased security fees and airline ticket price fluctuations. Minimum trip deposits are \$250 for all trips.

BSC Trips Cancellation Policy

1. The Club does not intend to unduly penalize a trip participant who cancels from a BSC trip. However, other trip participants should not have to incur additional costs due to your cancellation.
2. Deposits and payments made toward the trip reservations being cancelled will be held until such time as a determination can be made that the Club or trip participants will not incur additional costs due to non-recoverable costs.
3. Non-recoverable costs are defined as those that are associated with the trip that due to contractual obligations cannot be recovered when the individual cancels his/her trip. Non-recoverable also include those costs associated with replacing a person or persons on a trip (i.e., name change charges on airline tickets, etc.) Refunds, if any, will be made based on the non-recoverable involved plus a cancellation fee. Cancellation costs will not exceed the cost of the trip. Club cancellation fee will be dropped if non-recoverable costs exceed 50% of the trip cost.
4. Replacement of a trip participant by a trip participant is strictly prohibited. Only the Trip Leader or Assistant Trip Leader can replace a trip participant who is unable to go on the trip. The canceling trip participant may suggest a replacement candidate to the trip leader or assistant trip leader, however the canceling trip participant is responsible for the cancellation fee (if applicable) and any non-recoverable costs.
5. Be sure to know the cancellation dates in relation to the trip you select so that you can avoid monetary losses. The following cancellation policy is in effect in relation to BSC trips. NR=Non-recoverable costs

More than 125 days before departure - \$0
More than 110 days before departure - \$10 & NR

More than 80 days before departure - \$25 & NR
80 days or less before departure - \$35 & NR
